rob-in [rɒb'in] *noun*, a brown song bird with a red breast found in North America

ro-bot [rə'bot] *noun*, a programmed machine designed to do the work of a person

ro-bust [rə'bʌst] *adjective*, vigorous, strong, healthy

rock [rɒk] *noun*, 1) a hard, natural material of mineral origin, a stone 2) the mineral matter that makes up a large portion of the earth's crust *verb*, 3) to move back and forth or from side to side

rock-et [rɒk'ɪt] *noun*, 1) a missile, a spacecraft, *verb*, 2) to shoot into space 3) to move swiftly

rod [rɒd] *noun*, a thin pole

rode [rɒd] *past tense of ride*

ro-dent [rɒd'nt] *noun*, a small furry four-legged animal, like a squirrel, mouse or rat

ro-de-o [rə'de-ɔ] *noun*, a contest for people like cowhands to show their skill

rogue [rɒg] *noun*, a scoundrel

role [rɒl] *noun*, a part played by an actor, a characterization

roll [rɒl] *noun*, 1) a long, drawn out noise 2) a small rounded portion of bread, *verb*, 3) to move along by turning over and over 4) to make something flat by pressing it with a roller

ro-man nu-mer-als [rə-mæn'nɜ:mər-əlz] *noun*, plural, the number symbols used by Romans 2,500 years ago

ro-mance [rə-mæns'] *noun*, 1) the state of being in love 2) a story about love between people, *verb*, 3) to court romantically

ro-man-tic [rə-mæn'tɪk] *adjective*, 1) not based in fact, fanciful 2) thoughts of love and adventure

roof [rʊf] *noun*, 1) the external cover of a building 2) the top of the mouth

rook-ie [rʊk'i:] *noun*, a beginner

room [ru:m] *noun*, 1) one of the parts of a house separated by walls and doors 2) space

roost [ru:st] *noun*, 1) a perch, *verb*, 2) to sleep or rest on a perch

roost-er [ru:'stər] *noun*, a domestic male fowl, a cock

root [ru:t] *noun*, 1) the part of the plant that grows in the ground, its purpose is to hold it in the earth, to absorb moisture and to store nourishment, *verb*, 2) to dig up with the nose or snout 3) to cheer for a team

rope [rəp] *noun*, a heavy cord

rose [rəz] *noun*, 1) a shrub with a beautiful sweet smelling flower, *verb*, 2) the past tense of rise

ros-ter [rɒs'tər] *noun*, a list

ros-trum [rɒs'trəm] *noun*, a stage for public speaking, a pulpit

rot [rɒt] *verb*, to decompose, to decay gradually, to spoil

ro-ta-ry [rə'tə-ri] *noun*, rotating parts turning on an axis

ro-tate [rə'ta:t] *verb*, to turn around a center or axis, to revolve

ro-ta-tion [rə'ta'shən] *noun*, 1) a revolution, turning in a full circle 2) the growing of different crops in the same place usually in regular order
